Dr. Michael Ibrahim requested that I provide you with a letter of reference, and I am happy to do so. Michael held a position as a post-doctoral fellow in the Institute from 1996 through June of 1998, during which time I came to know him quite well and observe his research strengths and career potential.

Dr. Ibrahim's training and expertise is in pharmacokinetic modeling and in mathematical and physical applications of MRI imaging. Dr. Ibrahim has studied the transport of contrast agents into human and animal tissues and organs in-vivo. At UCI he examined the kinetics of transport from blood to CSF. The resulting paper was accepted in a highly respected journal and has been well received in the field. Michael added a valuable dimension to the research at our Institute. Michael's on-site presence provided other young investigators, post-docs and graduate students at our Institute with the opportunity to view relevant research questions from a new perspective. In fact, Michael can be credited with stimulating ventures down new avenues of research for many of our research team. He is an excellent lecturer and is able to present complex quantitative work with great clarity. He takes the task very serious and enjoys teaching. I believe he would be an asset to any teaching program.
